## **PROGRAM NOTES**

The journey to opening night for *Spamalot* has been a long one and arduous one, which began 22 months ago - with auditions at the end of January, 2020, and rehearsals that started the beginning of March of 2020 - in anticipation of performances in May, 2020.

After our first week of rehearsal, Gov. Baker imposed the state's Covid-19 shutdown, and we rescheduled the show for May, 2021. When the state's ban on live indoor theatre performances had not been lifted by March of 2021, we rescheduled **Spamalot** again - for December, 2021.

By the time we resumed rehearsing two months ago, five of the original 20 performers cast in the show had to drop out because of schedule conflicts, and replacements were recruited.

We are indebted to everyone who started out 22 months ago on this journey to *Spamalot*, regret the departure of those who could not continue with us, and are grateful for those cast members who took their places.

And, most important of all, we are excited to celebrate our arrival at our final destination with you - our audience.

degree in Biotechnology.

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




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
